


Read this article about Frank. He made something by mistake. As you read, think about the order in which things happen. Look for clue words.


## Who Invented the Popsidle's

In 1923, Frank Epperson started a business. You guessed it! He made and sold his ice pops. Epperson was now 29 years old. He was a father. His children called the ice pops "Pop's 'sicles." So Epperson changed the name to "Popsicle." He made 7 kinds of popsicles. Today, there are 30 kinds. The best seller is orange.
